

Instructions for use (with your smart-phone)

Choose your route; we recommend: South (Groenplaats) – East (Wapper) – North (Keizerstraat) – Centre (H. Conscienceplein Square). The KMSKA is located off-course.

Next to each image, **scan the QR code** to listen to the audio clip (~3 min).

For more information (also on your computer):

Open one of our three websites (see the back of the map).

Routes can be followed from one stop to the next.

Locations offers you all stops at a glance.

Artworks are presented in chronological order or by artist.

The **Timeline** is on its own web page.

Click on the **image** to enlarge it. Here you can zoom in.

Click on the **legend** to read the underlying page, the illustration, a quote, the full text, the route indications.

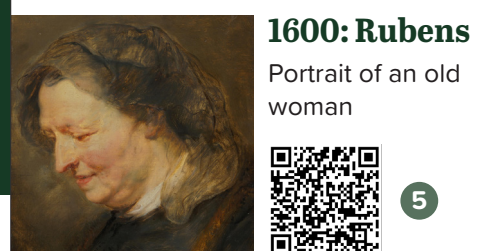

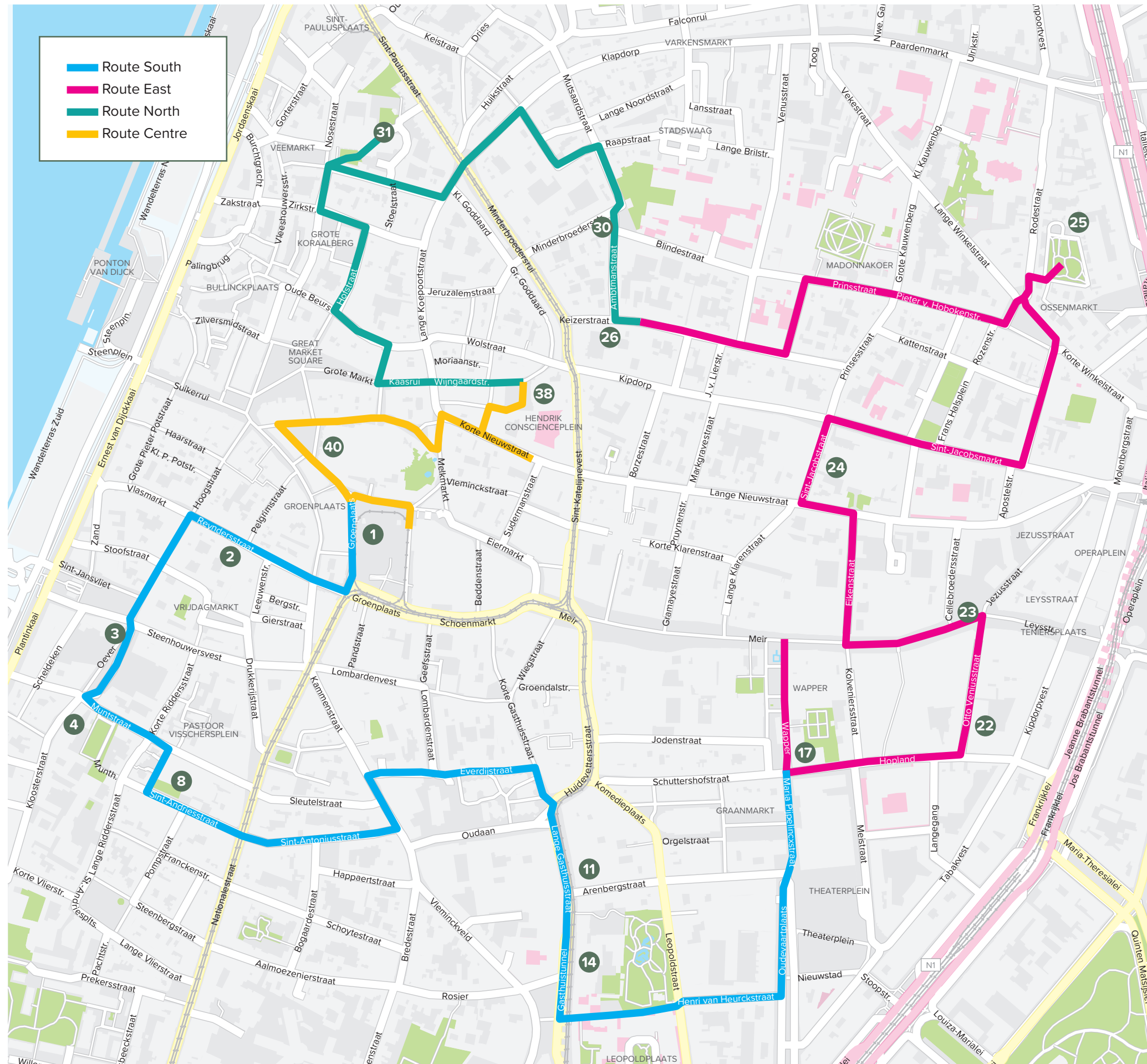
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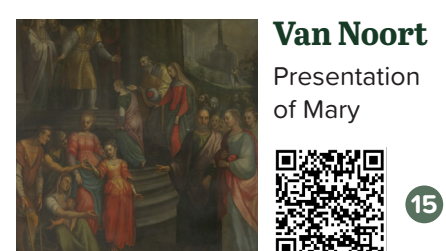
